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WHY THE LOS ANGELES YOUTH ORCHESTRA?

There is no better answer as to “Why a Los Angeles Youth Orchestra” than this 25th Anniversary LAYO Alum Ebook. Be inspired reading their stories and consider that approximately 1400 of them so far are helping make a better world. Some studied with us only a semester, many continued with us for up to ten years, more than their time at any single school.

As alums, they take creative, inspiring, and unpredictable pathways. They are physicists, fashion editors, novelists, psychologists, biologists, mathematicians, school teachers, early music specialists, lawyers, business entrepreneurs, performing arts administrators, and on and on! More than I ever imagined are now highly regarded professional musicians. They perform and teach all over the U.S., Canada, and Europe. They play in professional symphony orchestras, early music ensembles, and chamber ensembles. They teach in public schools, private schools, and universities. Many compose and conduct.

Tigran Arakeylan has conducted two youth orchestras and is now Music Director of Northwest Mahler Festival, ORS of Tacoma, and the Port Townsend Symphony. Dorian Bandy is a highly regarded musicologist and performer at McGill University. Benjy Fox-Rosen lives in Vienna where he has built a reputation as an expert in Klezmer and Yiddish music. He still performs double bass, but also sings and composes. Professional violinists Niv Ashkenazi and Ben Bartelt have returned to us and become expert coaches to our current students.

Jaya Nataraj has 20 publications in scientific research on neural stimulation treating children with movement disorders. Yunchao Zhang is finishing his doctorate in theoretical physics at MIT. Not far from MIT, two alums are finishing doctorates at Harvard—Clara Ross in astrophysics studying exo-planets and Katherine Norton studying biological and biomedical sciences.

Kate Perry is completing her doctorate in history at Vanderbilt University. Julia Winokur is in Chicago working at a marketing firm while she finishes her graduate degree in psychology. She just had a baby girl—Myla—on her first wedding anniversary with her wife. Thaïs Miller is now an accomplished novelist, poet, and playwright who recently received her Ph.D. from UC Santa Cruz and is now on the faculty at the University of Central Arkansas.



I heard recently that the great mission of a non-profit organization is to be a ladder, a ladder that helps take people from where they are to a higher place. LAYO can't take credit for the accomplishments of our alums, but we are that ladder. Discipline, working together as a tightly coordinated ensemble, exploring deep musical ideas, and above all, cultivating a love for music that lasts a lifetime—every LAYO student absorbs these skills. And I believe that these skills provide an invaluable emotional and intellectual anchor for all of them as they pursue their individual paths in our increasingly unstable world.

What have you been doing since LAYO?

I received my doctoral degree in conducting from the University of Washington. Currently, I serve as the Music Director of the Northwest Mahler Festival and the Port Townsend Symphony, as well as the Executive Director of Music Works Northwest.

What are some of your best memories from your time in LAYO?

During my graduate studies in California, Russell provided me with a wonderful opportunity to work with the LAYO. Through this experience, I gained invaluable insights during rehearsals and sectionals, conducted the orchestra numerous times, and learned the intricacies of running a non-profit organization. I am deeply grateful to LAYO and Russell for this incredible opportunity.



DORIAN BANDY

Violin 1997-2000

What have you been doing since LAYO?

I'm an associate professor of musicology and baroque violin at McGill University's Schulich School of Music, where I teach private students and coach chamber groups, conduct the baroque orchestra, and lecture in music history and music theory. I'm the author of a new book, *Mozart the Performer: Variations on the Showman's Art* (published in 2023), and I've released five solo or chamber CDs, including, recently, *Lovers and Mourners* (a recording of showpieces from 17th-century Germany) and a recording of Mozart's String Duos. I did my performance degrees at the Royal Academy of Music in London, my undergrad work at Cornell, and my PhD at the University of Glasgow.

What are some of your best memories from your time in LAYO?

My years in LAYO provided many formative musical experiences. First, there was simply the breadth of music we played. Thanks to LAYO, I grew up with an unusually thorough understanding of the repertoire from the inside. We covered a good 300+ years of music—but, just thinking about the style I now work with every day, it was with LAYO that I first played orchestral works of Haydn, Mozart, and Beethoven, and I'll always be grateful for this introduction. And it's to Russell's credit that he didn't just stick to the warhorses, but exposed us to lesser-played works like Haydn's 3rd Symphony (a particularly fond memory), something that then inspired further explorations and listening on my own. Even more, my peers and I benefitted hugely from the wonderful teaching LAYO exposed us to, both in full rehearsals and in sectionals.



MOHINI PRIYA BANERJEE

Violin 2003-2009

What have you been doing since LAYO?

Mohini graduated from North Hollywood Highly Gifted Magnet in 2009 and completed her undergraduate degree in Philosophy and Logic at Smith College. Mohini then completed a JD at Columbia Law School and an LLM at the London School of Economics. Mohini practiced in big law including Davis Polk and Latham Watkins for over 5 years and now works at a boutique law firm. She is based out of New Haven, CT.

Violin 2006-2008

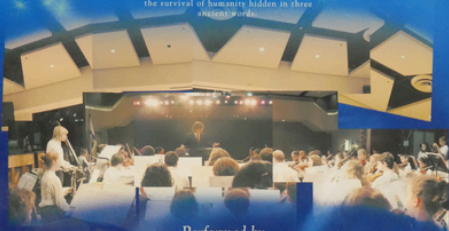
What have you been doing since LAYO?

I make my living doing a combination of performing, recording, and teaching. Every day is different from the next!

What are some of your best memories from your time in LAYO?

My best memories from LAYO are learning all sorts of wonderful compositions ranging all the way from Haydn to contemporary music, including the premiere of Russell's 2nd Symphony! Also, getting to know some wonderful friends, some of whom I am still in touch with today.



MAXWELL BECK

Double Bass 2017-2023

What have you been doing since LAYO?

I am a passionate composer and musician currently pursuing my Doctor of Music Arts (DMA) in composition and music technology at the Thornton School of Music, USC, where I also completed my undergraduate and my master's degrees. In addition to a burgeoning career in music composition for television with currently two shows on Hulu and Peacock, I have scored several films through the USC School of Cinematic Arts, and I work with a variety of musical artists in the pop and indie genres as a writer and producer. I have studied and played both double bass and electric bass extensively in the US and in Europe, and I work as an assistant teacher with Jazz Empowers, whose mission is transforming the lives of underserved youth through jazz education.

What are some of your best memories from your time in LAYO?

While touring Austria and the Czech Republic with LAYO in 2015, we stopped at Theresienstadt, a former concentration camp on the outskirts of Prague. Thousands of Jews were imprisoned here; many of them famous musicians. Listening to the guide speak about these musicians was a truly profound experience. The musicians were gone but their music remains. That theme played throughout the trip as we performed Dvořák in Dvořák Hall, explored Beethoven's home and played Haydn's symphony number 3 in Haydn Hall. Music's phenomenal ability to sustain through history was a theme on that trip. Longfellow said, 'Music is the universal language of mankind.' In the turbulent world we live in, music is one of the few facets of life that can unite us and even give hope. The lessons learned on that trip, and throughout my two years with LAYO shaped much of my career trajectory and was a powerful motivator for studying music through a global perspective.



GRANT BISHOP

Trumpet 2015-2017

What have you been doing since LAYO?

Following high school graduation in 2022, I became a student at Ecole Nationale De Cirque, a professional, full-time circus training college located in Montreal, Canada. I will graduate in June 2025 and then start my career as a circus performer! My major is juggling, with a "minor" concentration in Trampoline Wall. My classes include some academic subjects like French language and philosophy, and I take classes in acrobatics, Russian Swing, flexibility, trampoline (different from trampoline wall), strength training, dance, Russian Barre ... and lots of juggling! I still play trumpet with friends and even performed trumpet in a summer circus act that I was in right out of high school.

What are some of your best memories from your time in LAYO?

LAYO was a great preparation for performing with a group and practicing repeatedly until I mastered something. It's also very helpful to be able to read music.

Cello 2021-2023

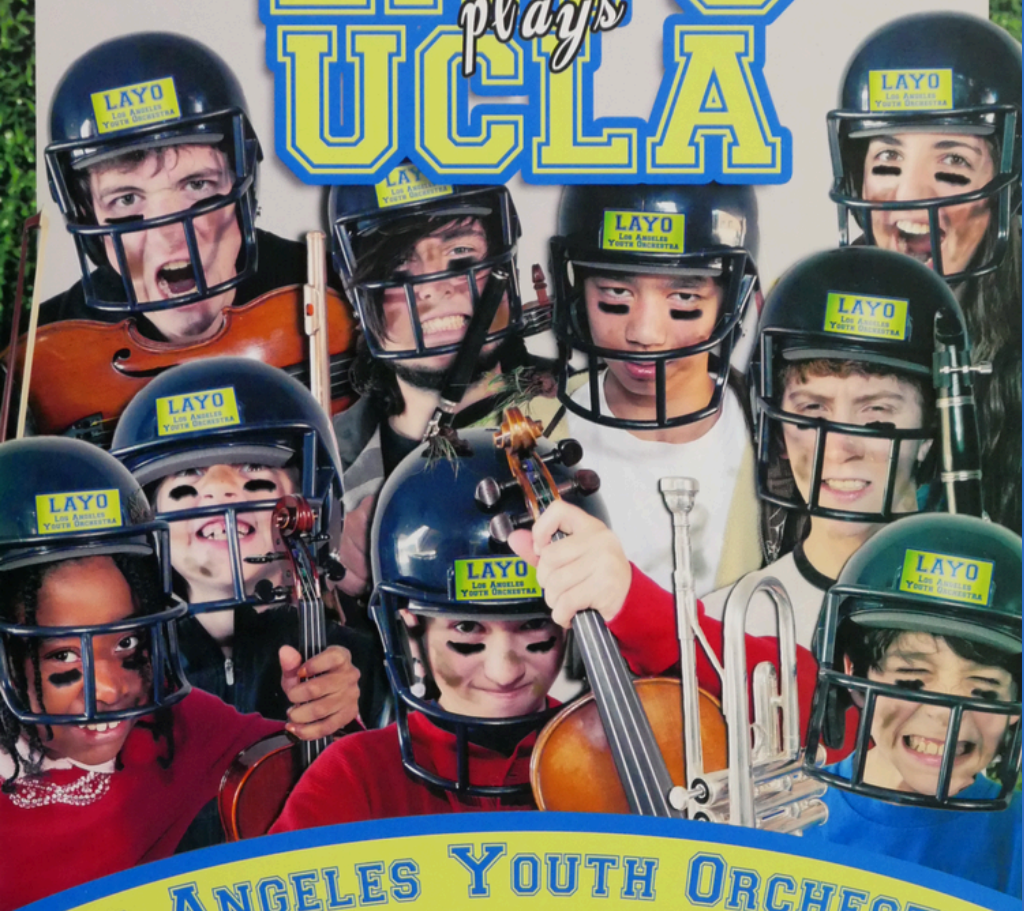
What have you been doing since LAYO?

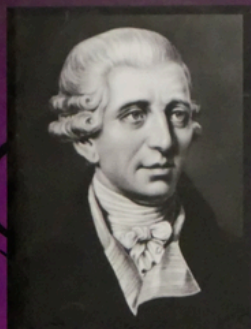
What are some of your best memories from your time in LAYO?

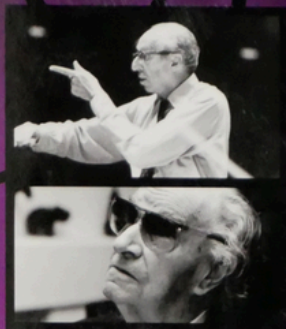

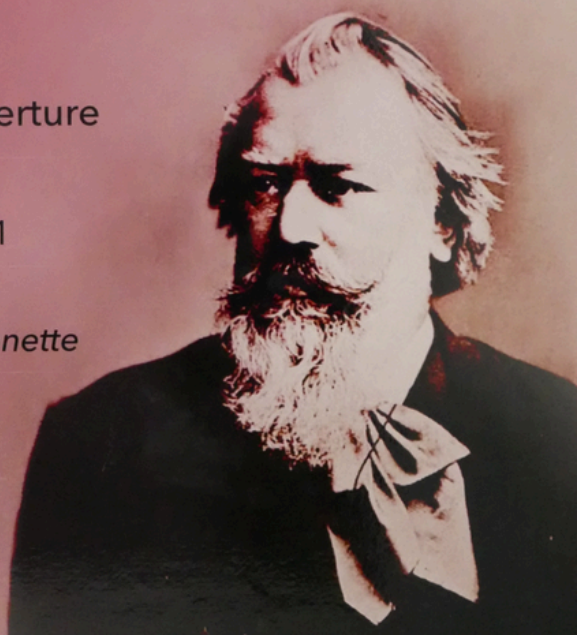

What have you been doing since LAYO?

After working for LAYO I freelanced in the Los Angeles area as a trumpeter and singer, and was the music director of a local community symphony orchestra. What have you been doing since LAYO?

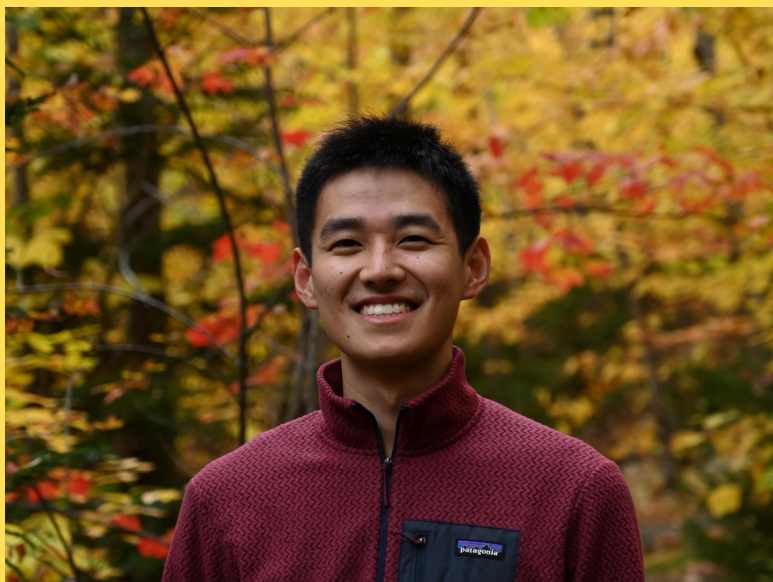
